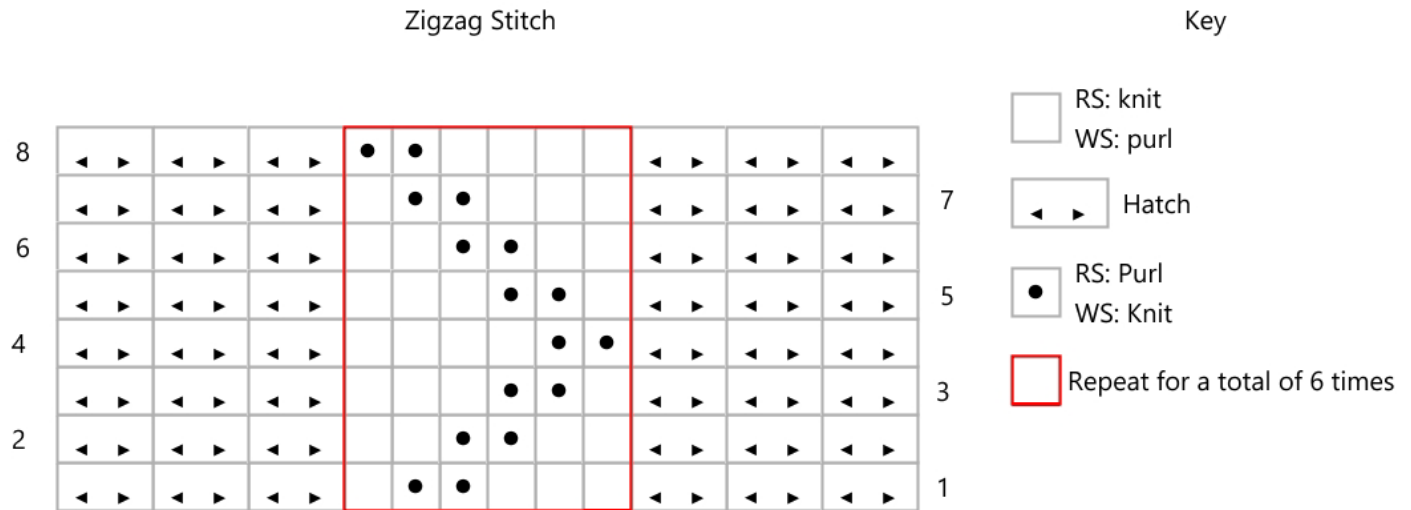


## Stitch 8 – Zigzag Stitch

The Zigzag Stitch, sometimes known as Marriage Lines, can be used to represent the typical highs and lows of married life.

This stitch also represents the twisting coastal paths that lead to the sea.

When you're going through a rocky patch, do a Zigzag Stitch to remind yourself to keep faith. When your relationship is going great, a zigzag reminds you not to be too smug.



### Written Instructions:

Row 1: (RS): HS/RS, SM, \*k3, p2, k1, repeat from \* to marker SM, HS/RS.

Row 2: (WS): HS/LS, SM, \*p2, k2, p2, repeat from \* to marker, SM, HS/LS.

Row 3: HS/RS, SM. \*k1, p2, k3, repeat from \* to marker, SM, HS/RS.

Row 4: HS/LS, SM, \*p4, k2, repeat from \* to marker, SM, HS/LS.

Row 5: Repeat Row 3.

Row 6: Repeat Row 2.

Row 7: Repeat Row 1.

Row 8: HS/LS, SM, \*k2, p4, repeat from \* to marker, SM, HS/LS.

Repeat Rows 1-8 3 times for a total of 24 pattern rows.

Knit 6 rows (garter stitch) before starting the next section of the scarf.
